

## Creative Generations Education Programme 2014

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Following the success of our pilot programme in 2013, the *Creative Generations* Programme will again be rolled out across three city centre schools; St. Patrick's National School for Girls, St. Patrick's National School for Boys and Ringsend College.

We aim to build upon relationships forged through the 2013 programme, to strengthen the Ringsend communities' ties with creative arts practice in our artists' studios and exhibitions' programmes at **TBG+S** alongside arts activities at **MH&C**.

Centred around the theme of 'Future Horizons', students' work will focus on their own imaginings of what lies ahead culturally and socially. Students will embark on a creative journey with the help of our TBG+S artists. Through studio visits and schools workshops, artists will share their creative practice and expertise.

Learning engagements included:

- Studio visits with TBG+S artists Neil Carroll and Mark O'Kelly.
- Exhibition tours of Peter Gallo in Gallery 1, Lois Weinbinger's 'Invasion of Metalics' at the Douglas Hyde Gallery, Dublin.
- Behind the scenes exhibition installation visit of Damir Očko at TBG+S.
- Artists-in-schools workshops with TBG+S artists Vanessa Donoso López and Lucy McKenna.
- Children's art exhibition at the Mason, Hayes & Curran building.
- Young curators project
- A panel of young people from Ringsend Technical Institute, aged 12-18, will be taught the process behind the art installations and exhibitions and will curate a section of the exhibition of the Mason Hayes & Curran Collection for November-Christmas 2014.
