Visual artist, Isadora Epstein has created a new commissioned performance 'The Return to Hy-Brasail' in the Library of the Royal Irish Academy (RIA) and in response to the RIA's manuscript collection. As part of the book fair, we are exhibiting works by artists involved in our events programme: Isadora Epstein, Andreas Kindler von Knobloch, Aisling McCoy, Liliane Puthod, Alice Rekab & Alison Ballance, Tamsin Snow, Tanad Williams. Guest publishers, artists and libraries will present their work throughout the building, and we are hosting the Market Kitchen café in the gallery space.
